

In the summer of 2018, a small but merry band of local Players and Shakespeare enthusiasts that included Lane Davies, Wes Phinney, Chase Parker, and Jeff Burr began discussing the idea of bringing together a group of local actors and fellow Bard-lovers to form the basis of a permanent Company that would present annual Shakespearean productions in **Burr Performing Arts Park**. In addition to the permanent Company, local high school and college students would be invited to participate in designated productions, and some of the major/title roles might be filled by professional actors, giving Company members and participating students a unique opportunity to work alongside and in collaboration with working actors. The idea became The Conasauga Shakespeare Coalition (CSC), and, with the help of local attorney **Chris Brown** and CPA Allen Bentley, the CSC was established as a not-for-profit performing arts organization dedicated primarily to the collected works of William Shakespeare. The Coalition received the blessing and endowment of friend and supporter Jeanne Burr with the plan to perform annual productions at Burr Performing Arts Park in partnership with the Creative Arts Guild and in cooperation with the Dalton Little Theatre and Artistic Civic Theatre. With all of this in place, The Conasauga Shakespeare Coalition presented its first production, *Henry V*, in summer of 2019.

Now, in the summer of 2023, we are set to continue our Company's mission of **engaging local talent in combination with professional working actors in order to bring to life the works of William Shakespeare for our local communities**, with our latest production, *Two Gentlemen of Verona*, which will be presented at Burr Park and at the Prater's Mill Historic Site in Varnell. As always, we are eternally grateful to all those that have made this production possible, especially the Creative Arts Guild, our sponsors and Coalition members.

# SYNOPSIS

#### ACT I

YOUNG FRIENDS VALENTINE AND PROTEUS SAY FAREWELL TO ONE ANOTHER AS VALENTINE RESOLVES TO TRAVEL. PROTEUS WILL NOT LEAVE VERONA, WHERE HIS BELOVED JULIA LIVES. MEANWHILE, JULIA'S MAID, LUCETTA, GIVES HER A LETTER FROM PROTEUS. JULIA TREASURES IT DESPITE HER OUTWARD SHOW OF CARELESSNESS FOR THE LOVE IT CONVEYS.

LATER, ANTONIO, PROTEUS'S FATHER, SENDS HIS SON TO MILAN, MUCH TO THE SORROW OF JULIA. PROTEUS AND JULIA PART WITH WORDS OF LOVE TO ONE ANOTHER.

#### THERE WILL BE A FIFTEEN MINUTE INTERMISSION

#### ACT II

PROTEUS IS JOINED BY LANCE, HIS SERVANT, AND LANCE'S DOG CRABB. WHILE AT THE DUKE'S COURT, PROTEUS FINDS THAT VALENTINE HAS FALLEN IN LOVE WITH SILVIA, DAUGHTER OF THE DUKE. SPEED, VALENTINE'S QUICK-WITTED PAGE, HELP'S VALENTINE REALISE THAT HIS LOVE IS RECIPROCATED. PROTEUS, WHO HAD EARNESTLY EXCHANGED RINGS AND VOWS OF FAITHFULNESS WITH JULIA BEFORE LEAVING VERONA, SEES SILVIA AND IMMEDIATELY CHANGES HIS ALLEGIANCE.

AS THE DUKE PLANS FOR THE FOOLISH THURIO TO MARRY SILVIA, VALENTINE DECIDES TO ELOPE WITH HER. HOWEVER, THE JEALOUS PROTEUS REVEALS VALENTINES PLOT TO THE DUKE, AND VALENTINE IS DISCOVERED WHILE CARRYING A ROPE LADDER. VALENTINE IS BANISHED FOR HIS SCHEMING AND LEAVES THE COURT WITH SPEED AS HIS COMPANION. IN HIS ABSENCE, PROTEUS WOOS SILVIA, BUT SHE SCORNS HIS SPEECHES AND MUSIC, URGING HIM TO REMEMBER JULIA. IN CONTRAST WITH ALL THIS COURTLY LOVE, LANCE CONSIDERS THE VIRTUES AND VICES OF THE MILKMAID HE WISHES TO MARRY.

IN VERONA, LUCETTA HAS HELPED JULIA TO GET A DISGUISE AS A PAGEBOY. SHE CALLS HERSELF SEBASTIAN TO FIND PROTEUS. UNRECOGNISED IN MILAN, SHE DOES INDEED FIND PROTEUS, AND HE SENDS HER TO COLLECT A PORTRAIT PROMISED BY SILVIA. SILVIA, MEANWHILE, REMAINS DEVOTED TO HER MEMORY OF VALENTINE. SILVIA PERSUADES SIR EGLAMOUR, A KNIGHT, TO ACCOMPANY HER IN A SEARCH OF VALENTINE IN MANTUA.

THE BANISHED VALENTINE IS CAPTURED BY A BAND OF NOBLE OUTLAWS WHO MAKE HIM THEIR CAPTAIN. SILVIA IS ALSO CAPTURED BY THE OUTLAWS WHILE SIR EGLAMOUR ESCAPES. THE DUKE AND THURIO TAKE PROTEUS (FOLLOWED BY JULIA/SEBASTIAN) IN PURSUIT OF SILVIA. WHEN THEY FIND HER WITH THE OUTLAWS, PROTEUS RESCUES HER. DESPITE SILVIA'S PROTESTS, PROTEUS ATTEMPTS TO FORCE HIMSELF ON HER, BUT VALENTINE STOPS HIM, AS LEADER OF THE OUTLAWS.

JULIA OVERHEARS THE YOUNG MEN'S ARGUMENT AND THEIR EVENTUAL RECONCILIATION. MISTAKING VALENTINE'S APPARENT WISH TO GIVE SILVIA TO PROTEUS, JULIA FAINTS IN FRONT OF THEM. PROTEUS RECOGNISES THE RING SHE CARRIES AS THE ONE HE GAVE TO JULIA. SHE REVEALS HER IDENTITY, AND PROTEUS'S LOVE FOR JULIA IS REVIVED. THE OUTLAWS ARRIVE WITH THEIR CAPTIVES, THE DUKE AND THURIO. THURIO DENIES SILVIA IN RESPONSE TO THREATS FROM VALENTINE. VALENTINE'S ATTACHMENT TO SILVIA IS REWARDED BY THE DUKE'S APPROVAL. THE TWO PAIRS OF LOVERS AGREE TO SHARE A WEDDING DAY. THE PLAY ENDS AS THE DUKE GIVES A FREE PARDON TO THE OUTLAWS AT VALENTINE'S REQUEST.

# **Two Gentlemen of Verona**

A seldom produced parody of conventions

Sometimes criticized as too simple to be written by Shakespeare and that he may have touched up someone else's feeble effort, and sometimes viewed as the work of a young and inexperienced playwright who was just beginning to experiment with comedy, contemporary views hold that *Two Gentlemen of Verona* is an intelligent parody of two literary conventions: "friendship literature" (tales of manly companionship disrupted by romance but generally restored) and romantic narrative (poetry and prose dealing with courtly love and adventure).

In *Two Gentlemen*, Shakespeare weaves good-natured ridicule of the stereotypical romantic narrative into his conventional friendship tale (lovers separated through an act of betrayal and, following trials and tribulations in which villainy is overcome, reunited in a happy ending) by presenting his hero, Valentine, as a comic and ridiculous hero. The best example of this is Valentine's inability to perceive his friend Proteus as anything other than a friend, even to the point of turning Silvia over to Proteus after saving her from Proteus, a bungled conclusion that is prevented only by the quick-witted Julia, who wants Proteus for herself, thus uniting Valentine with his beloved Silvia only by default.

Two characters in *Two Gentlemen* foreshadow those of future Shakespearean works: Launce is one of the Bard's early clown characters, whose monologues concerning his dog Crab are considered some of the best writing in the play; and Julia, whose assumption of control over events clearly lays the groundwork for heroines such as Rosalind in *As You Like It* and Viola in *Twelfth Night*.

Sources for the play may include the "friendship" tale of *Titus and Gisippus*, originally found in Boccacio's *Decameron*, which Shakespeare might have encountered in the 1531 English variant, Sir Thomas Elyot's *The Boke named the Governour*. In fact, several passages that resemble lines in the play can be found in Sir Thomas' version. Other sources include the prose romance *Diana Enamorada* by Portuguese author Jorge de Montemayor (1542) and Arthur Brooke's long poem *The Tragical History of Romeus and Juliet*, which was also the chief source for- well, you know...

Believed to have been written in 1598 (or somewhere between 1590 and 1595), *Two Gentlemen* was first published as part of the First Folio in 1623. No performance of the play is recorded before 1762, when David Garrick used an altered text, thus inspiring subsequent amendments to cover the play's discrepancies, and the addition of material for Launce and Speed. A 19<sup>th</sup> century operatic version of the play achieved modest success, as did two 20<sup>th</sup> century stagings: Joe Papp's 1971 musical adaptation and a 1988 New York production that featured a troupe of jugglers. In 1983, the BBC presented a made-for television adaptation as part of its complete cycle of the plays. Despite these successes, *Two Gentlemen of Verona* remains one of Shakespeare's least performed plays.






resident, Fallon is thrilled to have opportunity to work with the amazingly talented Conasauga Shakespeare Coalition and this remarkable cast!
